Louisiana Rice Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 stick butter or margarine
- 1 cup uncooked rice
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can beef consommé
- 1 small can sliced mushrooms
- 1 jar diced pimento (use medium or large jar per preference)
- 1 medium onion chopped

Directions

Preheat oven to 350. Place the stick of butter into a baking dish (9 x 9 works well). Melt the butter in the oven. Remove and stir in the remaining ingredients.

Bake covered for approx. 30 – 40 minutes until done. Remove cover and bake for about 10 more minutes to absorb moisture.

Mexican Cornbread

This dish makes a meal in itself! Serve with a salad and pinto beans if desired.

Batter –

1 cup cornmeal 2 eggs, beaten 1 cup milk ½ tsp. soda 3⁄4 tsp. salt 1 can cream style corn (15 oz.) 2 Tblsp. bacon drippings (optional)

Prepare ahead –

- 1/2 to 1 pound lean ground beef (browned and drained well)
- 1 medium to large onion, chopped
- ¹/₂ pound grated cheddar cheese
- 1 or 2 jalapeno peppers, chopped (can used more or less to taste)

Preheat oven to 350. Grease a 10 inch ovenproof skillet. Heat on stove top and sprinkle a thin layer of cornmeal in the skillet. Brown slightly. Pour in half of the batter. Sprinkle evenly one at a time: cheese, meat, onion, peppers. Pour remaining batter on top. Bake about 1 hour or until done.

Beginners Skeet Shooting 2012

Tuesday afternoons beginning April 10 and going through May approx. 5:30 pm till dark Bill Schweitzer and Terry Cullender along with several more skeet shooters will be sponsoring a beginning skeet shoot. This is primarily to help new shooters learn basics and gain a comfort level with the sport. There is no charge for the shoot except for the normal range fees. It is also open to members, nonmembers, guests, and shooters of all ages.

Bring your shotgun with you and the appropriate ammunition. Any gauge shotgun will work and the ammo is best with #9 or #8 shot but 7 ½ will be okay. We always have several youth size 20 gauge semi-auto shotguns for use if you need it. You need earplugs, glasses and a shooting bag or large pockets.

After 6 or 8 weeks of shooting you should become a fairly competent shooter and then with more practice you can take your ability to whatever level you want. We teach shooting safety and stress enjoyment. This is a social sport that should be fun. Come on out for an afternoon and try it out. For the first afternoon or two we work one on one with the raw beginners then try to place shooters in groups of similar abilities and then work with you as we see a need.

No one can learn to shoot shotgun without help. If you are not hitting a bird you cannot tell if you are in front, behind or above the bird. But an experienced shooter standing behind you while you shoot can tell you where you are shooting and what to do to correct whatever needs adjustment.

Skeet Manifesto

- The inevitable result of any shooting clinic is the elimination of the one critical unconscious motion that allowed you to compensate for all your other errors.
- 12. If it ain't broke, change guns.
- 13. When you find a method that doesn't work, stick with it.
- 14. Every shooter's best score happened when nobody who is here today was around.
- 15. A skeet shoot is a test of your skill against every other contestant's luck.
- 16. The target moves in two directions in the wind, away from a perfectly executed shot and into the worst move you've made all day.
- 17. Every time you run a round with the .410, there are three sub-20 rounds in your future. One of them is probably in the same event.
- 18. There are three things you can learn by looking at the end of your gun: if your front site is still in place, if the glove on your off hand has a hole in it, and how fast you can lose sight of the target and stop your swing.
- That reload with the short powder load always shows up when you are straight on Station 6 for the first time in the last six months.
- Some targets are broken despite what the shooter did—not because of what they did.

5-Stand / FITASC Results

On Sunday March 25th, seven of us got together for a 50 Target 5-Stand and 50 Target FITASC shoot.

The 5-Stand was a nice warm up and all the targets could be hit with an IC choke and in the end, **Jason Foshea**, bested the rest with a total of 48, running the first menu with 25 straight. **Darian Mock** and guest **Dan Spence** were close, both with a pair of 46s. **Wayne Johnson** won the second Lewis Class with a total of 38.

The 2nd 50 target event was a FITASC style shoot. This is where the shooter starts from a "lowgun" position (no preshouldering the gun) and cannot move the gun until the target can be seen. The format includes full use of the gun (2 shots) at the single targets which are shot first, then followed by 2 pairs of targets until 25 targets are thrown. Typically, FITASC targets are more challenging because the two shots on singles and is designed to better simulate a hunting experience.

We shot a 600 match - meaning we shot 2 slow fire, 2 timed fire and 2 rapid fire sets of targets, finishing at \sim 10:45 after getting started at \sim 9:15 AM.

It was a great day for shooting, temperatures were in the low 70's and no rain. We had 3 visitors and a member who had not shot with us for a year. Some of the regular shooters weren't here for unknown reasons.

Bill Edgell was the winner shooting 259/269 for a total of 528 with 11-Xs. He shot a S&W M 41 with a 7" barrel with a 2-hand hold.

Rick Ledbetter, a visitor, shot 251/268 for a total of 519, with a total number of Xs of ______. He was shooting .38 Specials in a 6" barreled S&W M 19 357, with a 2-hand hold. In one of the slow fire segments he shot an 88- with a .38 cal revolver. AND by the way he shot it DOUBLE ACTION!! WOW!

Floyd Jester was third, shooting 2 guns, a Benelli .32 Long match gun, and 38s in a 8 3/8" barreled S&W M 17 357. His scores were 223/249 for a total of 472 and 3Xs. Floyd used a 2-hand hold with both of his centerfire guns.
