Golden Anniversary Fruit Punch

Ingredients:

1 can (30 ounce size) fruit cocktail, undrained
1 can (29 ounce size) peaches, undrained
1 can (20 ounce size) crushed pineapple, undrained
4 medium bananas
2 cups sugar
2 cups water
1 can (12 ounce size) frozen orange juice concentrate,
thawed
2 tablespoons lemon juice
Lemon-lime soda, chilled

Directions

Place fruit cocktail in a blender. Cover and process until smooth. Pour into a large freezer container. Repeat with peaches and pineapple.

Place bananas, sugar and water in the blender. Process until smooth. Add to pureed fruit with orange juice concentrate and lemon juice and mix well.

Cover and freeze. Remove from the freezer 2 hours before serving. Just before serving, mash mixture with a potato masher or large spoon.

For each serving, combine 1/4 cup fruit slush with 3/4 cup lemon-lime soda.

Serves 64.

Ingredients:

1-1/2 pounds pork loin, cut into 6-ounce portions
1 cup all-purpose flour
1 tablespoon salt
1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
1 teaspoon granulated garlic
1 teaspoon paprika
1 egg
1/2 cup milk
2 teaspoons mustard
1 cup crushed unsalted crackers
1 cup panko bread crumbs
1/2 pound bacon, diced
1/2 diced yellow onion, approximately 1/2 cup
2 cups sliced button mushrooms
1/4 cup red wine
Olive oil, for frying
2 cups beef stock
2 tablespoons unsalted butter, room temperature
2 tablespoons chopped fresh Italian parsley leaves

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Pound pork slices between sheets of plastic wrap to 1/4-inch thickness. In a shallow medium bowl, mix together 3/4 cup flour with salt, pepper, garlic and paprika. In another shallow medium bowl, combine egg, milk and mustard. In another medium shallow bowl, combine cracker and panko crumbs. Dredge pork slices first in flour, then in egg wash, and finally in crumbs. Let set on a baking sheet fitted with a cooling rack for 5 minutes.

In a medium saute pan over medium heat cook the bacon until crispy. Remove from pan to drain on paper towels. In same pan with bacon fat, add onions and saute for 3 minutes. Add mushrooms and continue sauteing for 2 minutes. Stir in 1/4 cup flour. Cook flour to make roux until light brown, about 2 minutes. Add wine and cook for 3 minutes, reducing by 1/3, then add stock. Continue cooking to reduce by 1/3 again. Season with salt and pepper. Keep warm.

Heat 1/4-inch oil in thick saute pan or cast iron skillet to 350 degrees F. Cook pork evenly on both sides, about 5 minutes for the first side, 3 to 4 minutes for the second. Remove to platter when done. Add butter to sauce, stirring until it has melted. To serve, cover pork with sauce. Sprinkle with chopped bacon and fresh parsley to garnish.

THE RULES FOR THE OLD SCHOOL SKEET SHOOT

Come one come all to try your hand at shooting skeet like it was shot when men were men and cars had big old tail fins. It is the \$200 first winner-take-all Old School Skeet Shoot at GPGC's 50th Anniversary Party. Registration starts at 9:00 AM, and the rules of the game are as follows:

1. The shoot is open to all comers and all gauges. Registration will be at 9:00 A.M., immediately prior to the shoot.
2. The entry fee is \$7.00.
3. The Club's safety, firearm and ammo limitations apply.
4. To make it a little bit easier, there will be no station 8.
5. When calling for the bird, the gun must be held with the butt of the stock between the armpit and waist and cannot be shouldered until the bird appears.
6. First round is practice, no one will be eliminated.
7. Second round, two misses and the shooter is out.
8. Third round goes to single elimination. Last person left gets the \$200.
9. If all shooters miss on a station, the entire group reshoots the station.
10. Between shots, just like at the turkey shoot, cheering, heckling and applause from the audience and eliminated shooters will be encouraged.

World Warm-UP

The Grand Prairie Gun Club's World Warm-up was held September 14-16, 2012 and we had a great turnout and the shoot was full except for a few last minute drop-outs. Our friends from the UK came again along with shooters from Oklahoma, Montana, and Kansas to once again make this an international event. We sincerely thank all the shooters for coming out, their great sportsmanship and making the shoot a great success.

In Texas, hot is defined as 3 digits and none of them zero and rain is considered an anomaly and appreciated when we get it. For this shoot it was not hot and we got some rain so most Texas shooters were happy and the UK guys felt right at home. The temperatures were in the 70's to mid 80's with little wind and some light on and off rain. The mild temperatures and calm conditions made for good shooting across the boards.

Doubles started on Friday with 61 shooters and Johnny DeLeon swinging by the club, signing-up for doubles only, shooting a 99, winning gun champ and heading out of town with everyone asking "who was that guy". Kyle Shumaker took runner up with a 98 and Jon McDonald took third 97.

Saturday started with a great breakfast followed by 71 shooters in the 12 gauge event. 100's only got you into a shoot-off with Mike Schmitt outlasting everyone for Gun champ followed by Donnie Harris with runner-up and Jake Ratcliffe taking 3rd. We had grilled marinated chicken and all the trimmings for lunch and then started the 28 gauge about the same time the rain picked up. No 100's in the 28 gauge but 99's shot-off with Pat Byrne winning gun-champ, Tony May winning runner up followed by John Barnes.

Saturday evening after the shoot-offs, the Grand Prairie Gun Club put on the show we are best known for- Great Food. Actually we consider ourselves the cruise-ship of the skeet shooting circuit where everyone gains 10 pounds at the event. Chef Don Yeandle sliced fresh cut New York strips off the steers as we ran them by him and Master Chef Richard Kummer grilled them to perfection adding his secrete blend of herbs and spices. The steaks were served along with baked potatoes, salad, and hot baked brownies with ice-cream for desert.

Sunday started off with steak and eggs for breakfast, a little more rain and 66 shooters taking on the 20 gauge event. Again, 100's only gets you into a shoot-off with David Weintraub outlasting everyone for gun-champ followed by runner-up Mike Gershick and Pat Byrne. Sunday lunch was BBQ with all the fixin's including hot peach and apple cobbler supplied by our friends at Bartleys BBQ in Grapevine. After lunch we started the 410 event with 66 soggy shooters. Woody Anderson posted the only 100 followed by Van Lewis with a 99 and Jon McDonald with a 98. Woody's 410 score gave him the come from behind victor for HOA with a 391. John Barnes 390 took runner up followed by Pat Byrne's 389 that he had to earn in a 5 way shoot-off.

The Grand Prairie Gun Club prides itself on putting on great shoots with great targets, good food and Texas hospitality. This is all done through the club member volunteers that take a tremendous amount of pride in their club.
