

Rifle Range Rules

The Range Officer or first authorized GPGC member to arrive and sign in has control of the Range.

TO USE THE RIFLE RANGE YOU MUST:

- Yield to Scheduled Matches and Training Classes, which will have priority over open use of the range.
- Be a Grand Prairie Gun Club Member or Member guest.
- Have attended a "Safety Orientation Class" for the Rifle and Bullseye Pistol Range.
- Have your Membership ID card marked that you are qualified to use the Rifle and Bullseye Pistol Ranges, and display your Membership badge.
- Assure that Authorized Members, their Guests, Visitors, and the Range Officer on duty are signed in and out of the logbook when using these ranges.
- Assure that Visitors and Guests remain in the presence of an authorized member at all times.
- Assure that all firing will take place sitting on or standing behind the bench.

NO firing is allowed in front of the benches (prone, sitting or standing)

Prone position is allowed only when using the bench top tables atop the benches.

NO .50 caliber BMG is allowed. NO full automatic fire is allowed.

NO incendiary (tracer) ammunition is allowed

- Assure that Target frames are placed between baffle support columns.
It is your responsibility that all projectiles impact only the berm and not any of the wooden or concrete structures on the range.
- Assure that all firearms are unloaded and actions open during a cease fire or when being transported to/from the firing line.
- Assure **NO** shooting of cans, bottles, rocks or steel targets nor any wildlife nor any targets that depict a human form or outline of a human form. (e.g. CCP silhouettes)
- Assure absolutely **NO** alcohol or controlled substances are allowed on the property and no one under the influence of either is allowed on the property.
- Assure **NO** full camo (We are a sportsmen's club not a paramilitary organization)
- Assure **NO** shooting before 8:30 AM or after official sunset.

Bullseye Pistol Range Rules

The Range Officer or first authorized GPGC member to arrive and sign in has control of the Range.

Scheduled Matches and Training Classes will have priority over open use of the range.

Current Membership Cards must be carried and produced on request. Membership Badges must be displayed (with the current badge insert).

No shooting of cans, bottles, rocks or steel targets (except at scheduled "Silhouette Matches") **nor any targets that depict a human form or outline of a human. (e.g. CCP Blue Silhouettes)**

Target frames are to be placed between baffle support columns. Targets are to be placed in the Target Frames so the fired projectile impacts the steel "bullet catchers" at the 50 yard bunker. (i.e. mounted high in the frame if firing from the standing position or low in the frame if sitting and firing at bench level).

For safety and to prolong the life of the wooden structures on the range, it is your responsibility that all projectiles impact only the steel "bullet catchers".

Only paper targets are to be used. To extend the useful life of the target frames please only post one (1) target per frame where the center of the target is located at the vertical mid line of the frame.

Authorized guns: pistols, .22 rimfire rifles, black powder muzzle loading rifles, black powder muzzle & cylinder loading pistols
NO center fire rifles, NO shotguns, NO 50 BMG

Ammunition: .22 rimfire, .22 magnum rimfire, center fire straight-wall
NO bottlenecked rifle cartridges - NO 45-70
NO incendiary (tracer) rounds

(Certain tapered pistol cases are allowed e.g Tokarov, 357 SIG, 400 Corbon, 44-40, 38-40)

No guns will be carried in holsters. (Uniformed law enforcement officers excepted.)

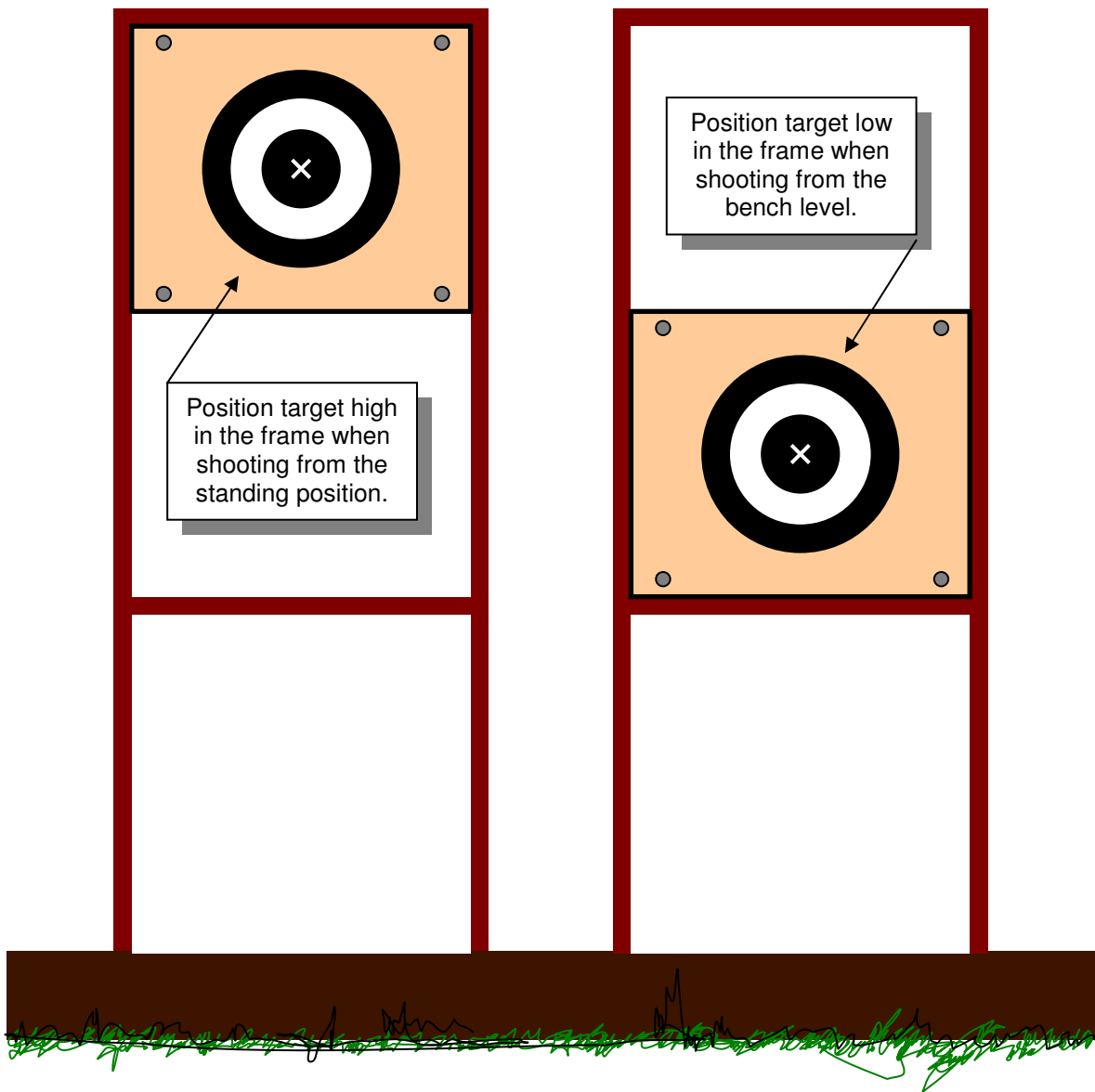
SAFETY, COMMON SENSE, and COURTESY

DURING A CEASE FIRE:

- All firearms are to be placed on the bench in an unloaded condition.
- Cylinders will be swung open - slides back - magazines removed - muzzles pointed down range.
- All present will remain behind the red firing line until the line is declared safe.
- No firearm will be handled or touched during a cease fire.
- Anyone present will immediately call a cease fire if they observe an unsafe situation.
- Do not handle another person's equipment or pick up their brass without permission.
- Do not cause unnecessary delays at the firing line or while posting or scoring targets.
- Please try to leave the range cleaner than you found it. (Brooms should be available)
- NO full camo apparel is allowed. (We are a Sportsman's Club - not a paramilitary organization.)
- Absolutely - NO alcohol or controlled substances are allowed or a person under their influence.
- Absolutely - NO wildlife will be shot at.
- Members are responsible for their guests and visitors.

It is each shooter's responsibility to ensure that bullets impact only the steel "bullet catcher" or berm at the end of the range and not any of the wooden structures on the range.

A person observed shooting purposely at baffle supports or willfully not complying with the range rules will be submitted to the Board for disciplinary action.
